- ① John Adams, Benjamin Franklin, Thomas Paine, and Thomas Jefferson were burdened with the task of writing the Declaration of Independence. These four men agreed that the document must be artistic as well as precise.  
X Adams was too rough, Franklin too sick, Paine too controversial, and so the task fell to Jefferson.
- ① Jefferson's Landlady recorded his struggle in her journal.
- X ⑤ As Jefferson paced, he accomplished little. Jefferson sent home for one of his violins. When the violin arrived, he would play for half an hour and write. When he began writing and writing. When he was working, quiet descended. A few days later, it was complete and ready to present. Music may have unlocked his linguistic genius and made him more receptive to the words.
